P.R.I.D.E. program

Improvements for Terrace Bay

The Township of Terrace Bay has approval for a \$100,000 P.R.I.D.E. project for 1991.

Dave Fulton, Terrace Bay clerk-treasurer, said the work will include signs indicating local attractions as well provide lighting along the highway pathway, and an extension of the sidewalk that now ends at the bottom of the hill on Lakeview Drive.

"As part of both the Tourism and the Waterfront studies, the consultants recommended co-ordinated signage for the town to show people where the such things as the beach, the gorge and the downtown area are located," he explained.

Improvements under this project include:

- \$65,900 for lighting, picnic areas, park benches and trash receptacles for the highway pathway.
- \$12,000 for sidewalks on Lakeview Drive.
- \$10,000 for local attraction

signage.

- \$8,000 for streetlight infilling.
- \$3,100 Simcoe Plaza picnic area.

The remaining \$1,000 will be used for administration costs.

The Ontario Ministry of Municipal Affairs pays for 50 per cent of the cost of these projects through the P.R.I.D.E. program. The Township pays the other 50 per cent.

The Program for Renewal, Improvement, Development and Economic Revitalization (P.R.I.D.E.) is a program designed to provide funds to help communities improve aging facilities and put basic facilities in place that the community doesn't have, Fulton said.

Municipalities can apply for funding every year, he continued, and, if the funding is approved, the project can be spread over three years.

The Township just finished a P.R.I.D.E. project it began in 1989.

All the work for the current P.R.I.D.E. project will be done in 1991, Fulton said.
