idea of team play, Joubert said. "There is more to hockey than just the game. We are trying to encourage teamwork and cooperation."

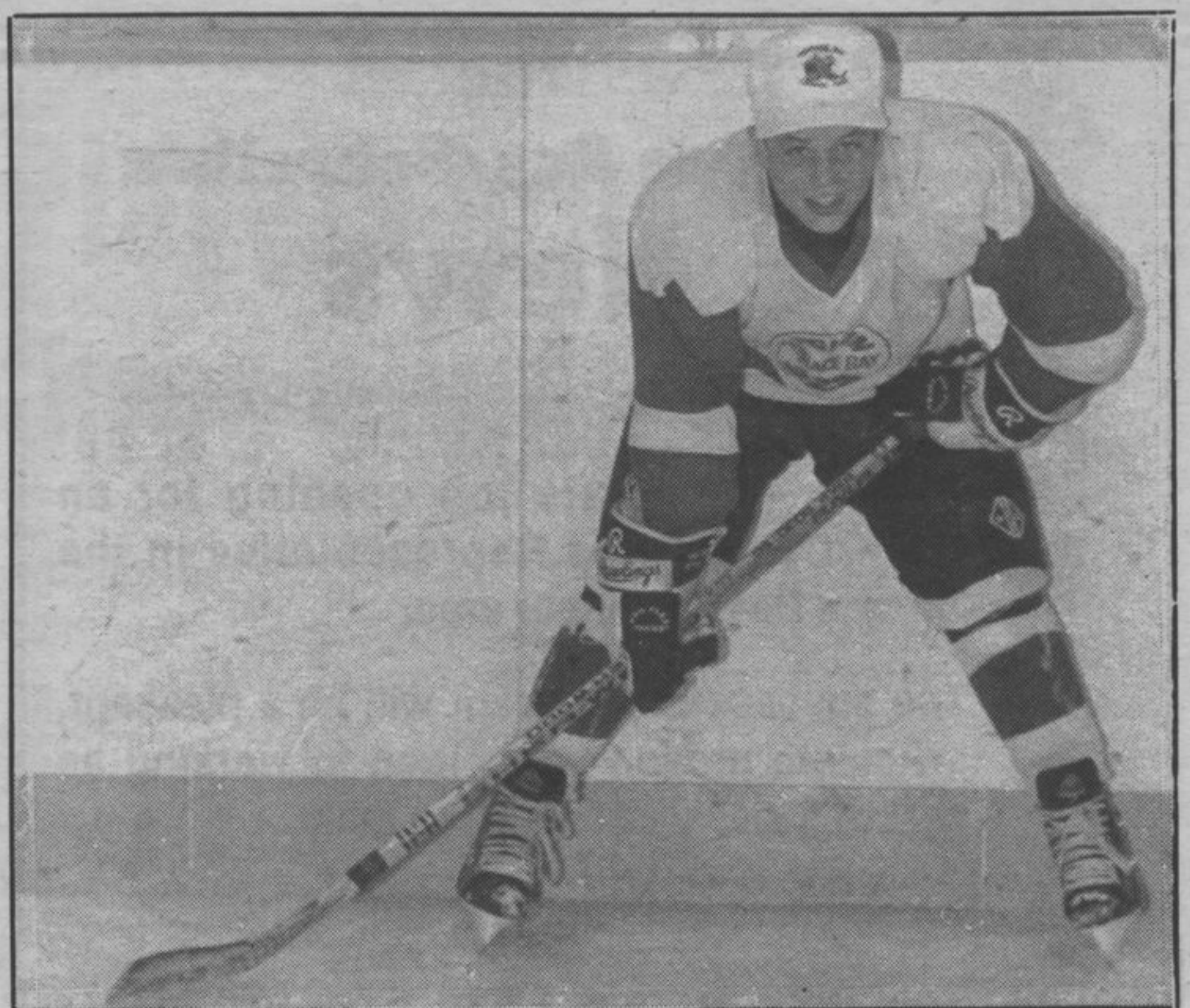
The original order of 46 hats is gone now but they are available to the public by contacting team manager Jim Chappell.
