

Schreiber Criminal Court Report

On 13 February 1991 Judge R. Mitchell presided over a full day court session.

The Chamber hired summer students last year to help update the Business Directory and it is now in print.


The students also helped the Chamber to set up the Telalert system amongst businesses in the community.


