

Students learn the value of our water

We take water for granted. Yet without it every living thing on earth would die.

About 60 per cent of our body is water and if you could squeeze yourself like lemon, you would get about 42 litres of water - that's equal to 168 glasses of lemonade.

These were just some of the facts Ministry of Natural Resources Conservation Officers Mike Kenny and Paul Dennis brought to the students of area public schools last week.

The presentations, which included a short video on water, were part of National Wildlife Week.

The message the Conservation Officers brought to the students was simple.

Looking after our water is something everybody has to be involved with. Water is liquid gold because we are not getting any new water.

The water we have today is the same water used by life on earth 4 billion years ago. It has been recycled and reused many times over.

National Wildlife Week is sponsored every year by the Canadian Wildlife Federation during the second week in April.

It was created by an Act of Parliament in 1947 to raise awareness among Canadians about the importance of conserving wildlife and wildlife habitat.
