Criminal Court Report

Judge R. Clark presided over Criminal Court on March 13, 1991. Michelle Boucher of Terrace Bay plead guilty to a Terrace Bay Police Charge of Cause Disturbance. She was given a conditional discharge. Boucher also plead guilty to an O.P.P. charge of Impaired Driving. She will be sentenced on 28 August 1991.

Cheryl Hermes of Terrace Bay plead guilty to a Terrace Bay Police charge of Theft. She was issued a suspended sentence and placed on probation for two years.

Richard Roy of Terrace Bay plead guilty to a Terrace Bay Police charge of Impaired Driving. He was issued a \$1,000 fine and lost his driving privilege for a one year period.

Wayne Sloan of Schreiber plead guilty to Possession of a Narcotic charge. He was given an absolute discharge.

Henry Smith of Terrace Bay plead guilty to two Terrace Bay Police charges of Assault and Breach of Probation.

FIRE SEASON

The fire season extends from April 1st to October 31st each year.

Fire Permits are required before starting a fire outdoors except when the fire is for cooking or for obtaining warmth.

Fire Permits are also required when starting a fire in an outdoor incinerator. The incinerator must be an approved model and it must be operated in an approved location.

Proclamation

WHEREAS: Every year, more than 1,000 Canadian workers are killed on the job

AND WHEREAS: Thousands more are permanently disabled.

AND WHEREAS: Hundreds of thousands are injured

AND WHEREAS: Thousands of others die from cancer, lung disease, and other ailments caused by exposure to toxic substances at their workplaces.

AND WHEREAS: April 28 of each year has been chosen by the Canadian Labour congress as:

- a Day of Mourning for these victims of workplace accidents and disease;
- a day to remember the supreme sacrifice they have been forced to make in order to earn a living;
- a day to renew approaches to governments for tougher occupational health and safety standards, and more effective Compensation;
- a day to rededicate ourselves to the goal of making Canada's workplaces safer.
