# Community involvement can help

Drug abuse is a problem that can only be solved by a community and public interest in tackling the problem was clearly evident by the number of people who attended last Monday's education program at Lake Superior High School's Terrace Bay campus.

Sergeant Ben Jenkins of the Royal Canadian Mounted Police Drug Awareness Program and Norman Panzica, consultant and lecturer with the Council on Drug Abuse, spoke to a crowd of 102 citizens on what they really need to know about drug abuse.

The message of both speakers was clear - If you are concerned about drug abuse in your community you have to become involved.

Jenkins said peer pressure is usually the reason people first

experiment with drugs.

"Peer pressure is a very powerful influence in society, especially amongst children

who's brain development isn't complete until the age of 11 or 12."

The other major factor for drug use is stress, he said. Society creates a lot of pressure on young and old alike to perform well and to be successful in everything they attempt to do.

When people don't meet these expectations their self-esteem
