Triple C store converts to apartments

It offered room and board and its dining room had quite a reputation.

Helen LeBlanc, who has lived next door for 25 years with her husband Edgar, said "St. Jean's, with home cooked meals, was a really nice place to eat."

After the St Jeans let the business go it changed hands fairly regularly, Le Blanc said.

During the sixties it was a place to play pinball and pool and get a quick snack.

It became known as Triple C when Dom Carmisan began operating it.

LeBlanc said she is going to miss watching all the kids go back and forth between the store and the high school.

It was a place they could bring their bag lunch, buy chips and pop and play videos, todays version of pinball machines, she said



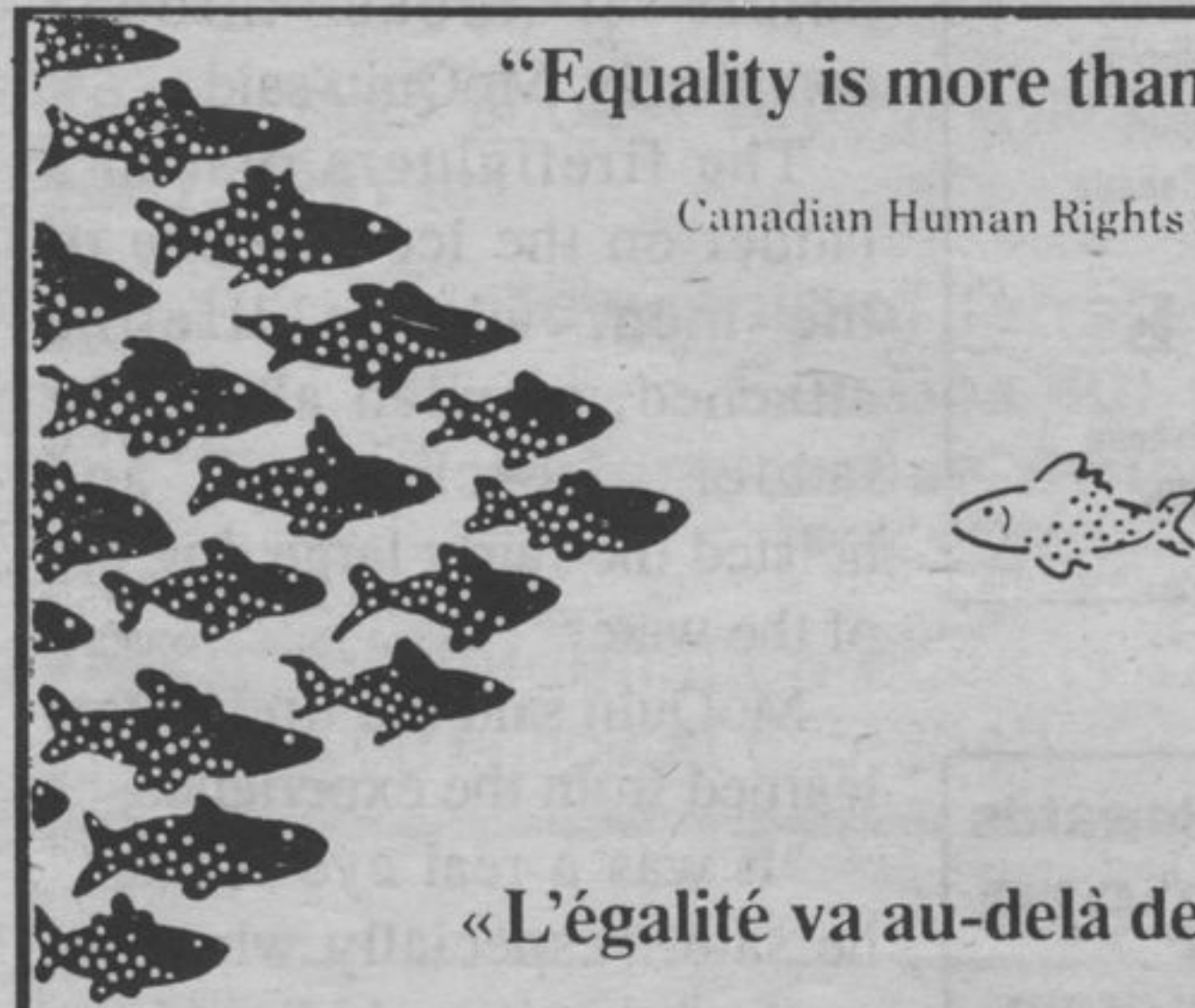

1991 Spruce Budworm Control Program

As part of the Ministry of Natural Resources' ongoing program to regenerate and protect our forests, Boreal West Region will be aerial spraying the biological insecticide, Bacillus thuringiensis, Bt on selected areas surrounding Thunder Bay, Nipigon, Geraldton and Terrace Bay to control spruce budworm, beginning on or about

June 1, 1991.
