

## Community Action Awards now accepting nominations

The Office for Disability Issues is now accepting nominations for the 1991 Community Action Awards. Twelve people, at least six of whom have disabilities, will be chosen as Award recipients from nominations collected from across Ontario.

"The program is designed to honour the achievements of men and women who have done much to improve the quality of life of Ontarians with disabilities," said Elaine Ziemba, Minister of Citizenship with Responsibility for Disability Issues.

Now in its sixth consecutive year, the Community Action awards program has encompassed a wide range of achievements.
