The Business Plan will contain future trail development ideas, marketing concepts, the trans provincial trail system and much more.

ernment agencies and the private sector would entertain funding assistance to snowmobiling in Northern Ontario," says Don Lumley. Snowmobiling in Northern Ontario appears to be contingent on a number of factors which will be addressed in the N.O.S.A. Business Plan.
