himself. He and his partner had to be located.

"The priority for the team is to save lives," Gemmill explained, "If that means putting out the fire to protect the people they will do that first."

If it means locating and protecting the people first and then fighting the fire and restoring the ventilation they will do that first."

It is up to the team to decide on a course of action and they are judged, in part, on their decision.

There are three parts to the competitions; a written examination, the preparation of the equipment to go underground and then actually solving the problem created by the simulated emergency.

"They have so many things they have to do and they are being watched by a number of different judges," Gemmill said.

In total there are approximately 30 people acting as judges, patients and

assistants during a competition.

The scoring is done on a demerit point basis. Each team starts with zero, gaining demerit points each time something is not done properly.

The point spreads at the competitions is usually very close indicating how keen the competition is.

"I would estimate that there are in the area of 350-400 demerit points," Gemmill explained.

The point spread between the top team, Shebandowan Mine and the Minnova team, which was fourth, was about 20 demerits. The spread between the second team, David Bell Mine, and Minnova was only about 2/12 - 3 demerit points.

The Shebandowan Mine, McIssac Exploration Ltd. took first place at the Schreiber competitions, David Bell Mine, Teck Corona, was second, Williams Mine, Williams Operating Corp., third

The Minnova Mines, Winston Lake Division Ltd.

Mine Rescue Team of Mark Cottrell, Emmett Houston, Sam Cloutier, John McKay, Peter Ingram, John LeClair, spare man Dean Mills and briefing officer Joe Boaro was fourth.

"The team that won on that day were the winners for that day, but all the teams are winners on any given day," he added.

Each team is debriefed after competitions by a Ministry of Labour Training Officer, in this case Ernie Gulliver, to learn from the exercise.
