### Crafts for Kids

#### The Waterscope

1. Take a plastic bucket (or a plastic jug or tin can) and ask an adult to help you cut and remove a big circle from the bottom of the bucket. If using the jug or tin can, cut open both ends.
2. Place a piece of plastic wrap over the other end of the bucket and secure with a rubber band or elastic rope. If using the jug or can, cover the hole on the bottom.

Note: Make sure the elastic is tight enough to keep the water from leaking in.

Now you have a waterscope. Take it to the beach or pond, push it into the water, hold it steady. The waterscope will eliminate the reflection that blurs your vision and you will clearly see the bottom. The deeper you push the scope into the water, the stronger the magnification you'll get; but don't completely submerge it. If water does get in, just pour it out.

#### Residential Real Property Tax Credit For Seniors

The Township Council has authorized a uniform Credit of up to \$300.00 to the owners of residential real property against their property taxes provided that:

1. the owner, or the spouse of the owner occupy the property and it is their personal residence
2. the owner, or the spouse of the owner has reached the age of 65
3. must have owned the residential property for at least one year
4. only one credit per year per property is allowed
5. the owner or the spouse of the owner is receiving a monthly guaranteed Income supplement under Part II of the Old Age Security Act (Canada)

The municipal tax credit will apply to any property taxes remaining after the receipt of the Provincial elderly tax assistance program credits.

The \$300.00 provided by the Township is a maximum. If your taxes are \$800.00 and you receive \$600.00 from the provincial elderly tax assistance program you will receive only \$200.00 from the Township.
