

## PURCHASING OR DEVELOPING PROPERTY AROUND WATER

#### WHAT YOU SHOULD KNOW

- The Ontario Ministry of Natural Resources and the Federal Department of Fisheries and Oceans have increased their emphasis on fish habitat protection.
- Most shoreline projects will require approval -e.g., docks, breakwalls, dredging, grading and
  vegetation removal. Some projects may be denied
  or may require a considerable alteration of plans
  before work can begin.
- Section 35(1) of the Federal Fisheries Act provides that "no person shall carry on any work or undertaking that results in the harmful alteration, disruption or destruction of fish habitat".
- Failure to comply with the law may result in fines of up to \$1 million and/or up to three years imprisonment upon conviction.
- Contact your local Ministry of Natural Resources office to obtain further information.
