

CALL FOR EXPRESSED INTEREST TO PARTICIPATE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF A CONSERVATION POLICY FOR OLD GROWTH **ECOSYSTEMS IN ONTARIO**

The Ministry of Natural Resources will establish a Policy Advisory Committee to assist in the development of a conservation policy for old growth forest ecosystems in Ontario. The conservation policy will be guided by the Comprehensive Forest Policy Framework. It will be developed:

- based on a review of existing information relative to old growth forest ecosystems and their conservation:
- with input and recommendations from groups and individuals expressing interest in the conservation of old growth forest ecosystems;
- recommending the collection of new information on biological, social, cultural and economic values related to old growth forest ecosystems in the long term; and

through public consultation, using consensus-building techniques, to develop options which will be presented to the Minister of Natural Resources.

The Policy Advisory Committee will consist of individuals who have:

- expressed interest in integrated resource management;
- expertise in biological, economic, social or cultural areas;
- demonstrated an ability to participate in a group setting and to work toward a common goal; and
- approximately fifty days over a period of up to two years to devote to this policy development initiative.

Expressions of interest in participating in the Old Growth Ecosystem Policy Advisory Committee will be accepted until September 13, 1991.
