Great Lakes basin;

\*Establish sunset permits with fixed dates for phasing out toxic chemicals. Any industrial process that contributes to persistent toxic pollution must be eliminated.

"Any program that claims to address the Great Lakes persistent toxic crisis, but fails to include at least these three elements, isn't serious about pollution prevention," Weinberg said.

Persistent toxics include thousands of the most deadly substances known, including dioxins, furans, other organochlorines, and many heavy metals. Persistent toxic chemicals accumulate in fatty tissues and become more concentrated and dangerous as they move up the food chain. In both animals and humans, they are associated with birth defects, reproductive failure, immunological disorders, learning and behaviour disorders, cancer, tumors, genetic mutations and other health problems. Most are foreign to nature and many have never been studied or tracked.

Lake Nipigon MPP Gilles Pouliot is looking forward to the challenge of his new job as Minister of Transportation.

"Almost every person is affected by it," said Pouliot of his responsibility for Ontario's highways. Transportation Minister is as a higher profile portfolio than Pouliot's old job as Minister of Mines.

Pouliot is still the Minister Responsible for Francophone Affairs in Bob Rae's NDP Government.

The July 31 cabinet shuffle saw Minister of Northern Development and Mines Shelley Martel take on the additional responsibility of Minister of Mines from Pouliot.

Pouliot said there are no big changes planned for the ministry. While he says the government will serve the real needs of the province, the recession will limit them from doing too much.

"You have to see where the power of the purse will take

you," he said, adding that the people of Ontario can not take any more taxes.

The appointment of Pouliot to the Transportation Ministry is the first of a northern MPP in a number of years.

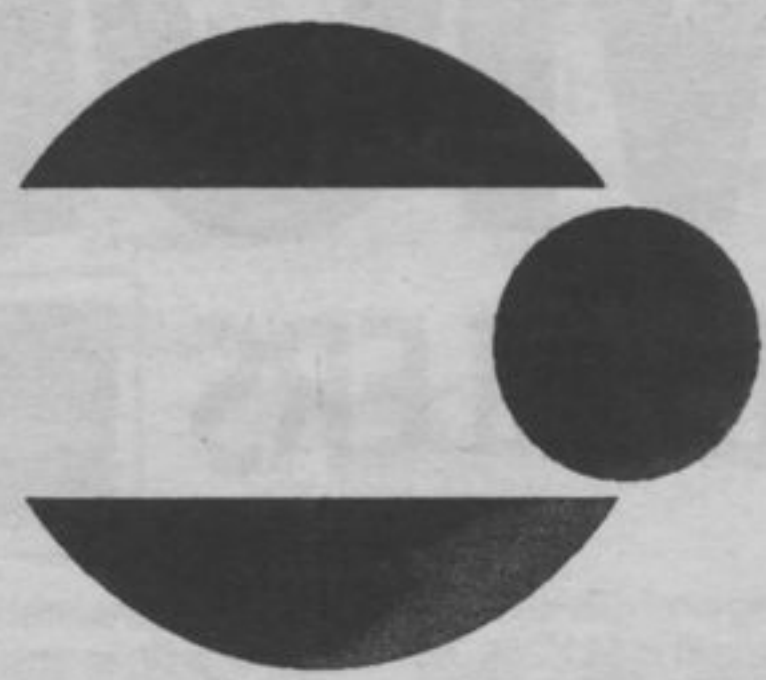
