

The rest, unfortunately, have not yet shed their handcuffs.

But there are a courageous few, like Bob and Al, who realize their "handcuffs" contain enough gold so that, by melting them, they now have the resources to start a modest new venture. For the sake of our collective economic future in northern Ontario, we can only wish them the best of luck.


