# New constable on the job for Terrace Bay town police

Terrace Bay's newest police officer began last week with some vigorous desk work.

Const. Nick Cirillo, 26, is originally from Toronto, and has spent the last four years working for the York Regional Police.

Cirillo said he came here because he needed a change of scenery.

"I wanted to get out of the big city," Cirillo said.

"And I also wanted to come and live in the North for awhile."

Although no one else in his family is a police officer, Cirillo said it was what he always wanted to do.

He learned of the Terrace Bay job when it was posted in the York Police Department last summer.

He was hired by the town on Sept. 23.

Cirillo's wife Lorraine, whom he married last February, will be joining him here Nov. 1.

He said it's been a bit of an adjustment coming to a small town from the city, but he's fitting in nicely.

The type and number of incidents he's dealing with here are considerably different than what he's used to, but that is also a nice change, Cirillo said.

"They take very well to strangers around here," he said. "It's a very outgoing community."

Cirillo's introduction to the area was still a shock, however. He had the misfortune of driving here on Oct. 5, the night of the year's first snowstorm.

"I drove up on Saturday and there were people off on the side of the road, and I couldn't believe it," he said.

An opening on the Terrace Bay force was created when former Terrace Bay Police Chief Don Kidder left last summer, and was replaced by Chief Wes Fenton.
