New Fire Boss for Terrace Bay

Nestor Trach has been chosen by Town Council to become the new fire chief of the Terrace Bay Fire Department, effective Nov. 1.

Trach has a two-year contract with the town, and will be paid an initial salary of \$5,700 a year, subject to an annual review by Council.

The position has been vacant since former Chief Rollie MoQuin resigned. Trach was the only person considered for the job of leading the 22 member volunteer force.

Two deputy fire chiefs have also been appointed; Ken Benoit and Moe Stark also have two year contracts, and will be paid \$3,950 for their services.

At full strength, the Terrace Bay force has 25 members, including the Chief and the two deputies.

Union dispute solved without arbitration

An eleventh hour agreement between managers at the Thunder Bay Homes for the Aged and the United Paperworkers Union has prevented a dispute from going before the Ontario Labour Relations Board.

As the three members of the board waited, management and the union hammered out an agreement that allowed Mona Cano to return to work at Birchwood Terrace in Terrace Bay.

All sides in the dispute say they are pleased with the Board today (Wednesday)," agreement.

"But we managed to come to an agreement without them, so we took them to the airport so they could fly back to Toronto."

Talrico said that prior to the agreement, there had been no indication management was willing to settle the case without the help of the board.

"No, there wasn't. We had met several times to try and work out an agreement, but we just couldn't come to terms," he said.

"Then (on Tuesday night) we were meeting, just to go made the initial contact. They said they wanted to settle this without going to the board."

"The way I see it, it took a great deal of cooperation between both parties," he added.

Cano had been an employee at Birchwood Terrace for more than 10 years when she was affected by staffing cuts last spring.

"Their official reason (for laying her off) was that she wouldn't accept alternate work," said Talrico.

"But there was no alternate work offered."
