YOUTH OPPORTUNITY

Canada World Youth's exchange programme offers the chance for young people between the ages of 17-20 to learn about people in other cultures.

All costs are covered by Canada World Youth, making the experience open to young people from all backgrounds.

The programme lasts for a total of seven months; half the time is spent in Canada, and the other half in an Asian, African, Latin American or Caribbean country.

Participants are matched with a counterpart from the exchange country, live with families, engage in voluntary work projects and use non-formal education techniques to explore social issues.

There are no formal qualifications, but applicants should be open-minded, physically capable of hard work, and interested in learning about other cultures and values.

More than 7,000 young Canadians, and an equal number of young people from other cultures, have participated in the programme since its inception 20 years ago.

MCLEOD SUPPORTED IN LEADERSHIP BID

Ten Northern Ontario Liberals have announced their support for Thunder Bay MPP Lyn McLeod in the upcoming Ontario Liberal Party leadership contest.

Those declaring their support for McLeod include Algoma Manitoulin MPP Mike Brown, Kenora's Frank Miclash, former Minister of Northern Development René Fontaine, past Port Arthur MPP Taras Kozyra, and Thunder Bay Nipigon MP Joe Comuzzi.

"Lyn McLeod held ministerial portfolios that were crucial to the development of the North," said Mike Brown. "I was always confident that the interests of the North were well represented as long as Lyn had a seat around the Cabinet table."

Frank Miclash was impressed with the way McLeod could balance the varied interests of the province.

"Lyn is a friend to the North as she is a friend to all regions of the province. When she was in cabinet, the concerns of one region were never sacrificed for the interests of another. That's what Ontario is looking for in a Premier," said Mr. Miclash.

René Fontaine, who worked with McLeod in the Cabinet from 1987-1990, said that McLeod was a strong voice for the North.

"Lyn McLeod was a driving force behind economic and social change," he said. "Lyn could be counted on to consult with the people and then do the right thing."

"You learn a lot about an MPP if her riding neighbours yours," said Taras Kozyra. "Lyn always remembered that her first duty was to serve her constituents."

The Liberal leadership campaign is expected to start officially in mid-November culminating in a February Leadership Selection Convention.

NWODN APPOINTEES

The Northwestern Ontario Development Network has announced its first ever Board of Directors.

The board consists of Ed Hoshizaki, representing Sioux Lookout; Ted Couch of Atikokan; Karen Sosnowski, Thunder Bay; Harry Kelly, Beardmore/Geraldton/Longlac/Nakina; David Bagler, Manitowage; Jeff Port, Sioux Narrows/Nestor Falls; and Geoff Gillion, Rainy River District.

Incorporated last April, the network is a regional organization made up of economic development professionals from White River to the Manitoba Boundary.

Its mandate is to provide a forum for the communities of northwestern Ontario to manage common problems and

develop collective, constructive solutions.

The network is currently concentrating on issues such as resource management and tourism.

It receives funding from the Ontario Ministry of Northern Development and Mines, Employment and Immigration, and the communities of northwestern Ontario.

Improving communication links between the economic development offices across the region is also one of the network's current projects.

It has established an electronic communication system across the region, which offers a bulletin board system, electronic mail and files transfer capabilities.

The Network also acts as a liaison with other regions of Canada, Ontario, and Northeast Minnesota.

HALL OF FAME

The Selection Committee of the Northwestern Ontario Sports Hall of Fame is current-

ly accepting nominations for consideration for induction into the Hall of Fame for 1992.

The categories of induction include athletes, builders and teams. Any individual born in northwestern Ontario, or a resident of the area during the period of time they developed the skills that led to their distinction as an athlete, are eligible.

Any team that has won a national title, or was selected to represent Canada at the international level, and any individual dedicated who has dedicated ten years or more to the building side of sports, are eligible for consideration.

All nominations must be made on an official nomination form, complete with a documented resume of the nominee. Closing date for nominations is Jan 31, 1992.


