

Don't forget about Freddy just because it's Christmas

Fundraising efforts for the McCausland Hospital's new X-ray machine are a bit behind schedule, says Clem Fewer, the hospital's CEO.

The hospital has raised about \$120,000 for the "Freddy the Fracture Finder" fund so far.

A new machine is expected to cost \$350,000.

"We don't like to be pestering people all the time," Fewer says. "But it's for the betterment of the community."

Fewer says the hospital hopes to be able to purchase the new machine by 1993.

"The old X-ray machine is old, and it's not giving good pictures," he says.

The hospital has employed a number of methods to raise money, including selling t-shirts, baseball caps, and calendars.

The calendars, which sell for \$20 each, are part of a lottery the McCausland is holding.

On Jan. 1, a draw for \$1,000 will be held. And each day

after that, there will be a draw for \$10, a weekly draw for \$50, and, on Dec. 1, 1992, a draw for \$2,000 will be held.

"Local businesses have also been very generous," Fewer says.

A By-Law to stop and close the public street or highway more particularly described as follows:
