

# Committee looking for theme

on architecture." Because of the cost of building the cement and metal structures, she also says it would also be the most expensive of the three themes.

"Whichever theme is chosen, it will be used in all the design aspects, including signage and the lighting (for the pathway along the corridor)," Johnson says.

"Our goal really isn't to change the look of Terrace Bay, it's to enhance the look we already have," says committee member Mike Moore.

"We don't want to create an image of what we're not, we want to improve on what we already are."

Moore says the role of the committee is to determine how residents of Terrace Bay want to proceed.

"That's why Susan and I are going to the schools, and why we're putting the concept drawings up in various spots around town," he says. "It's so people can see them, and tell us how they see the project developing."

The concept drawings contain details of what each theme would entail in practice.

"The drawings will be available for public viewing at the Library from the middle of December until early January," Johnson says.

Moore and Johnson say the timetable for completing the Corridor is 5-10 years.

"People shouldn't think of it as something that's going to happen immediately," Moore says.

"But that's the nice thing about the corridor — it's something that can develop and evolve over time. The corridor

will be the focal point of the beautification, but it's not going to end there."

Moore says that long term plans include incorporating Simcoe Plaza, and even residential areas, into the overall theme.

"We're just trying to enhance what the local people are doing now," he says.

"What we're really looking for is input from the public, because what we're doing is for the local people first," Johnson says.

"We believe that tourists will want to do what the local people are doing."




**THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TERRACE BAY**
