
Terrace Bay Ringette Seniors win gold in weekend tourney

It was Capy's second point of the afternoon, and she went on to lead all scorers in the game, ringing up four goals and one assist for five points.

The second period was all Terrace Bay, as they scored five unanswered goals to clinch the game.

Also tallying for Terrace Bay was France Bilodeau and Melissa Helmink, who also had an assist.

Kellie Pelletier scored two goals and an assist for Thunder Bay, while Stephanie Renda chimed in with one goal.

The Terrace Bay team was presented with their medals during an on ice ceremony immediately following the game.

display of teamwork and desire, our seniors won the gold medal in a crowd pleaser against Thunder Bay.


Crowd support all weekend was great, and was certainly a factor in influencing out teams to play so well.

And thanks to the parent volunteers who timed games, kept score, baked sweets and made sandwiches. billetted out of town players and made our guests welcome in our hospitality sweet


All three teams made it to the gold/silver game on Sunday, the first time tournament organizer Gerry Withers can recall that remarkable feat happening.

NOTICE RATION OF HANDI-CAPPED TRANSIT SERVICE

The Townships of Terrace Bay and Schreiber, have agreed to jointly sponsor a Handi-Capped Transit Service. The Township of Schreiber, will act as the delivery agency for the service.

An agreement has been reached with Birchwood Terrace Home for the Aged, whereby the specially equipped bus used at the Home, will be used to provide the service. The service initially will be on a trial basis, to determine, if there is a genuine need for the service on a long term basis.

There is an Operating Committee established, which will provide direction as to policy, and procedures for ther service, and which will, as part of its mandate, have an Eligibility Committee who will evaluate applications for the service.

Applications for the service are available, at the Municipal Office in Schreiber, and the Muncipal Office in Terrace BaY. All physically disabled persons who are unable to use conventional transit must apply, using the application form.

Please contact the Municipal Office, in Schreiber, for more information as to service, it is expected, that the service will commence February 1, 1992. All interested physically disabled persons are requested to complete the application as soon as possible and submit to:
