Criminal court

On Wednesday, Jan. 15, Judge Lester presided over lengthy Criminal Court proceedings in Schreiber.

Sheppard of Wayne Schreiber plead guilty to a Schreiber OPP charge of Assault, and was fined a six month peace bond.

Funding for futures

The Schreiber - Terrace Bay

has received \$549,997 in funding for 1992 operations from the Employment and Immigration Ministry.

Revenue Minister Otto Jelinek, on behalf of Employment and Immigration Minister Bernard Valcourt, announced the funding in a press release dated Jan. 8.

"The corporation will receive \$549,997 so that it may continue its successful efforts to facilitate the establishment, expansion and stabilization of small business," the press release quoted Jelinek as saying.

Community Futures are aimed at helping communities hard hit by layoffs or unemployment to identify, develop and implement measures to expand employment and help individuals adjust to their economic environment.




