Failure to register dog (LICENCE)	\$43.75
Permit dog to run at large	43.75
Kennel maintenance fee	5.00

A dog caught running at large will cost \$5.00 on the first day, and each day thereafter.

Your cooperation is requested in maintaining control of your pets.

judged in two categories: children aged 11 and under, and a seniors category for anyone 12 and older.

Changes have also been made to the balloting procedure for choosing carnival kings and queens.

Last year, ballots were distributed at local businesses, which led to some abuse, Larivee said.

"This year, when people pick up their carnival buttons—which will be available during the first week of February—they will receive a ballot," he said.

nival a dinner theatre will be held in support of the Lake Superior High School's Enrichment Activities.

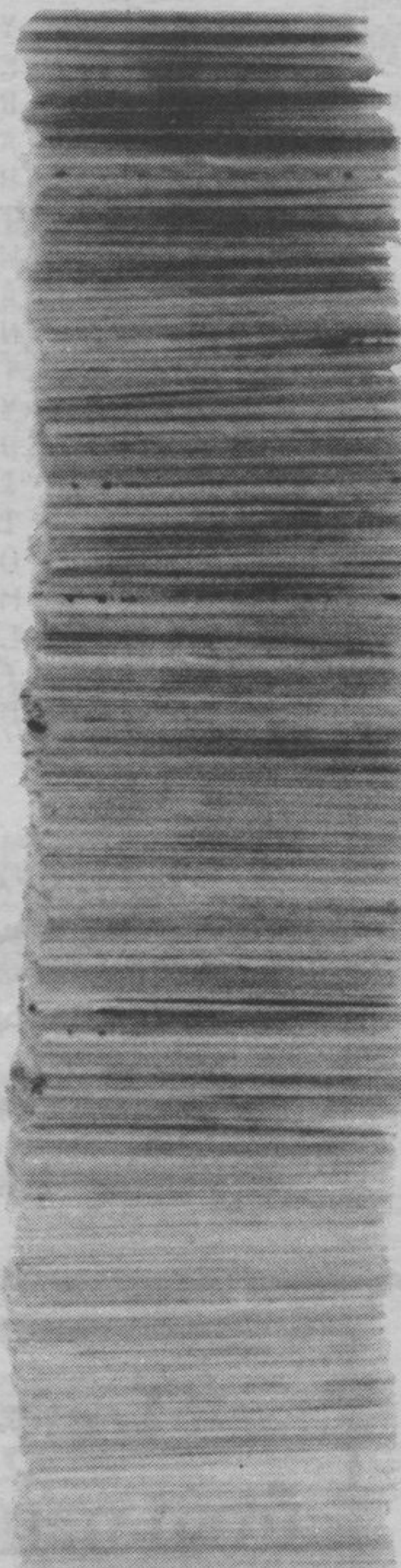
