about 40 residents in Schreiber Friday morning.

Angus sold t-shirts and sweatshirts at the end of the meeting in Terrace Bay, with logos printed on them supporting the restoration of cut Via Rail lines.

In a press release dated Jan. 31, Angus said he had learned many things as a result of the tour.

"It's clear from everything I heard that Via is still needed along the North Shore," he

said.

"It's equally clear that the bus service is not providing an acceptable alternative to the people in these communities."

Some of the more common concerns raised were that seniors were no longer able to travel, families could not afford to visit one another, and tourism dollars were being lost—and as a result, jobs—because of the decline in the tourist trade.
