should have no problem, and it's our intent to do that."

Henderson points to their plans to hire a qualified marine archeologist to complete a detailed strategic plan for the *Gunilda* project, as proof of their good intentions.

But regardless of whether that strategic plan is eventually approved by the Ontario heritage Board, the ethical questions remain. Just because the *Gunilda* may be owned by entrepreneurs, does that give them the right to do what they want with something many people regard as a public resource?

Should our heritage resources be left as they are to promote the north or transformed into a promoter's commodity? Those questions will no doubt be hotly discussed, in the months ahead.
