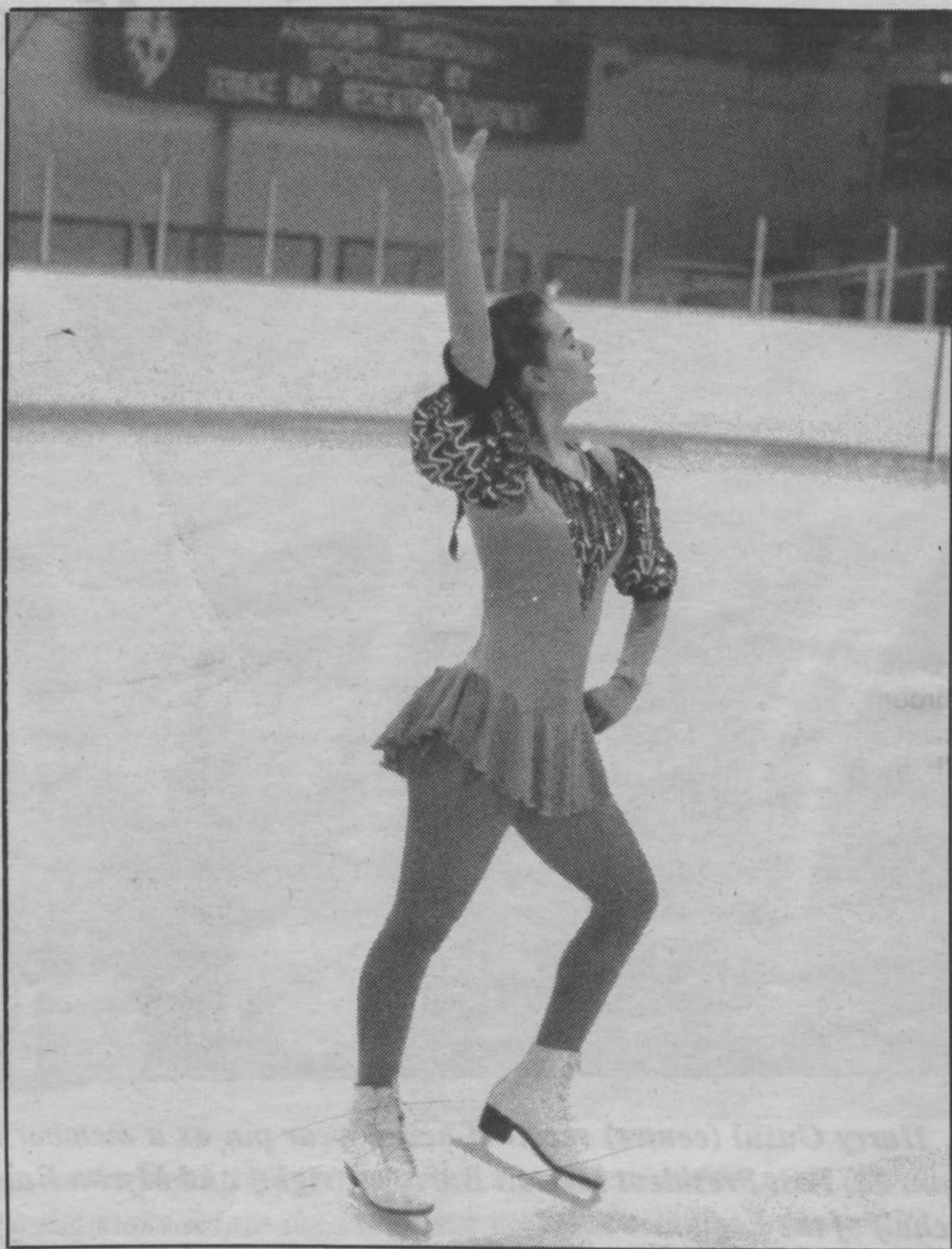
The North Shore Inter-Club Figure skating Championships held in Terrace Bay last Jan. 31, Feb. 1 and 2 was, by all accounts, a big success.
