The Ministry of Natural Resources is in the middle of its annual stocking of Lake Superior with lake trout.

In all, the MNR will pump 300,000 lake trout into the North Shore from Heron Bay to Rossport.

The stocking program has arrested the decline in the trout population in the lake, a decline largely attributed to lamprey, a trout predator.

"People along the North Shore know what lamprey are," says MNR Conservation Officer Mike Kenny.

"They hate them."

Kenny says the lamprey population has been significantly reduced by the MNR in a separate program.
