## K-C, Unions, sign pact to reduce work barriers, ensure long-term profitability of Terrace Bay mill

Management and both of the unions at Kimberly-Clark are optimistic that the agreement they signed earlier this month will help ensure the mill's long-term profitability.

"It should be a major agreement toward helping the longevity of the mill in Terrace Bay," said Jody

Davis, of the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW), local 1861.

"It's a positive thing thus far, and we're happy about that."

The agreement, which is the result of nearly four years of negotiations, is a three-way pact between the company, the IBEW, and the United Paperworkers International Union (UPIU), local 665.

Davis says the unions have agreed to broaden their trade guidelines.

"Between the UPIU and the IBEW, we have agreed to talk about sharing some jurisdic-

tions between the electricians and the engine room mechanics," Davis says. "The specifics will be worked out by a joint committee made up of electricians, the engine room mechanics and the company."

As a result of the deal, tradespeople will receive a raise of up to 75 cents an hour over the next year, and other hourly employees will receive up to 25 cents, Davis says.

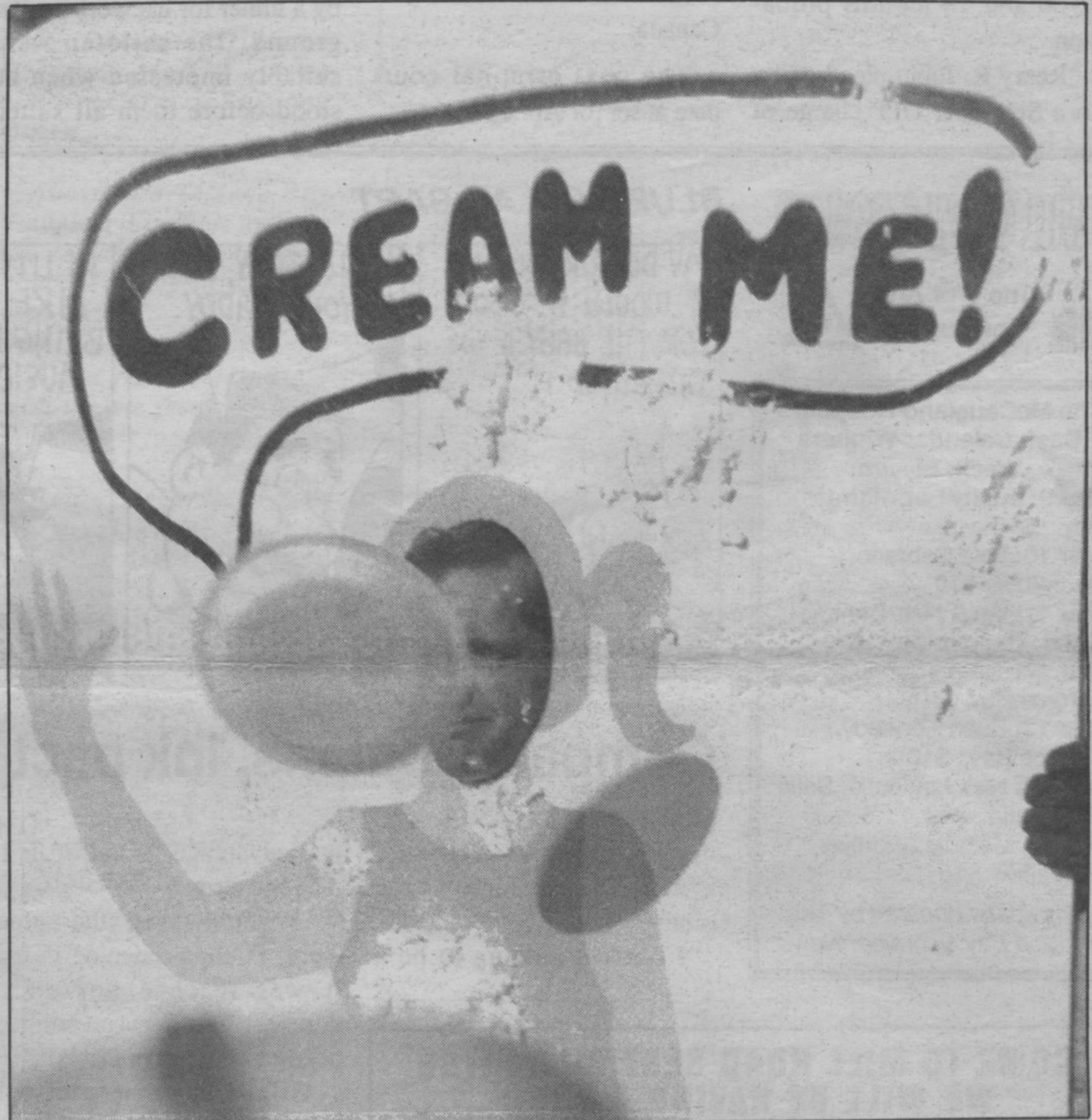

## Banking machine would be good for businesses, residents

It's time for Schreiber/Terrace Bay to join the 1990s and get a bank machine, says Aguasabon Chamber of Commerce President Leslie Dickson.

"We seem to be one of the few communities of any significant size that doesn't have a banking machine," Dickson says.

"Manitouwadge has one,

Marathons has two, Nipigon has one, but we don't."

In a joint venture by the Chamber and the Schreiber-Terrace Bay Community Futures Office, residents are being surveyed to find out how interested they are in having a machine installed.

"I think the response has been fairly good, but we won't know for sure until we get the final tally," she says.

Dickson says the results will

be collected at the end of this week. The results will then be compiled and sent to each district manager of the local banks and credit unions.

"And then we hope that they'll get back to us and we enter into a discussion about whether they will or won't put a machine in," she says.

"Their concern is that these things cost a lot of money, and that they need so many transactions per day to make them

viable. And what they're saying is that the area is too small, that there isn't enough bank transactions to make it economically viable."

She has had preliminary talks with the managers already, and Dickson says the regional manager of the Canadian Imperial Bank of Commerce said he will be "interested" to see what the results of the survey will be.
