

get enough positive feedback from the public to show (the managers) that there's a strong possibility that a bank machine would be viable."

Not having a machine in the community puts local businesses at a disadvantage, she says.

"People whose only access to money was a banking machine have actually been turned away from here and told they had to go to Marathon," she says.

"And that means that people who would have bought gas, or stayed overnight, or bought food, were sent down the road to make their purchases."

And local businesses are put in the position of acting as banks after banking hours for local people, Dickson says.

"They're not only asked to cash cheques for items purchased, but also in excess of items purchased," she says.

"It's like getting along without indoor plumbing. In 1992, how many people want to use an outhouse?"
