OBITUARY
Murray - Gregg Hammett Murray, in his 83rd year, passed away on April 13, 1992, at the Fergus hospital. He had suffered from Alzheimer Disease. Gregg was the only child of John and Myrtle Murray of Cambridge. He is survived by his beloved wife, Pauline, whom he wed in 1935. They had three children: Jon, at home, Richard of Barrie; and Jean Connor and her husband, Ted Hawkins, of Terrace Bay. Gregg graduated from Queen's University and belonged to the Superannuated Teachers of Ontario. He had been a very respected high school teacher and coach in many communities including: New Liskeard, Cobalt, Ridgetown, and Fergus. Gregg enjoyed reading, travelling, swimming, watching baseball, and going on long walks with his dog. According to his wishes, Gregg's body was donated to medical science and there were no services.

IBC wants province to adopt graduated licensing

The Insurance Bureau of Canada (IBC) has launched a public awareness campaign advocating graduated licensing for new drivers in Ontario.

IBC Chairman Murray Wallace says that insurance companies have been calling on governments to institute graduated licensing since 1983, in order to lower collision risks for new drivers.

"In New Zealand, for example, graduated licensing has reduced the number of deaths and injuries to new drivers by at least 25 per cent," says Wallace. "And yet in this province, we continue to read about tragedies involving new drivers."

Graduated licensing is a step-by-step learning process that new drivers go through

before acquiring full driving privileges. New drivers would spend a defined length of time at each stage and would abide by a set of conditions in order to "graduate" to the next stage.

Some of the conditions that have demonstrated considerable potential to prevent accidents include: supervision of the new driver by a fully licensed adult driver; a curfew on night driving; and a requirement for zero blood alcohol content.

Young and novice drivers have been a particular concern for several years. The IBC commissioned a major research on the subject in 1988, and in 1990 released the results in a study, "New to the Road", prepared by the Traffic Injury Research Foundation of Cana-

da. The study shows that all new drivers face significantly higher risk of death or injury from traffic collisions.

The Ontario government has studied graduated licensing but has not yet implemented it.

"In 1990, we responded to the Ontario government's request for input to a proposed graduated licensing model for
