Students at Schreiber Public School are participating in the "Discovery Box" program, which is designed to give students a glimpse into what life is like for other students in dif-

ferent parts of the country.

Students in grade 2, 4 and 7/8 each put together a box containing items which describe what life is like here.

The grade 2 class is linked with a grade 2 class in Mississauga, Ont.; the grade 4 class with a class in Elmira, Ont.;

and the grade 7/8 class with a class in St. Catherine's, Ont.

Each box contains items such as wood chips from Kimberly Clark, iron ore from Minnova, rocks, driftwood, Schreiber buttons, a class picture and post cards.

In addition to those items, each box contains a personal note from the class addressed to the teacher at the other school.

The discovery boxes were sent by Greyhound bus to the three other classes last Wednesday afternoon. In turn, the classes in Schreiber will receive discovery boxes from the other students.

The program itself is part of Canada's 125th birthday celebrations.
