conveyed to the public that the bigger you are, the more you can get away with. OPSEU believes such a double standard should stop immedi-

ately."

OPSEU's brief recommends that "the Ministry of Natural Resources remove from its operation policies any double standards concerning the vigour with which violations are prosecuted under the

Crown Timber Act, the Fisheries Act, or other legislation administered by the MNR;" and that "the province of Ontario review the penalties that can be imposed on violators of the Crown Timber Act and all other legislation."
