Community briefs

Provincial Court

On Wednesday, June 10, 1992, Justice of the Peace Butterin presided over Provincial Offences Court.

Onesime Cloutier was found guilty of a Schreiber OPP charge of Using a plate not authorized for a vehicle. He was fined \$103.75

Scott Hunter plead guilty to a Terrace Bay Noise Complaint by-law. He was given a fine of \$103.75.

Kim Smith and Gerhard Trapp were found guilty of three counts under the Game and Fish Act, Ministry of Natural Resources charges. The men were fined \$3,000 each, and both had their hunting privileges revoked for three years.

Bruce Edward Vogt of the Northwest Territories was found guilty of a Schreiber OPP charge of Driving while under suspension. He was given a \$503.75 fine.

Offences Court date is set for July 15, 1992.

Two vehicles for police

Terrace Bay Police Services will remain a two-vehicle force after the Police Services Board rescinded its decision to make it a three-vehicle force.

At its meeting May 7, the board decided that because of budget restraints, the township couldn't afford to maintain three vehicles.

It had originally voted to keep the Police Service's Jimmy as a back-up. But it will now be sold when the force buys a new vehicle.

Composting reduces garbage

Composting—a great way to reduce the garbage load going to our landfill sites. Compostable materials make up to 20 to 30 per cent of

household garbage. It's also one of the most economical ways to recycle. The resulting humus can be used on a lawns and gardens in place of costly fertilizers.

Composting is a simple matter of layering vegetable and fruit scraps, grass clippings, garden waste, and black earth into a pile or composting unit. To speed the process you may want to give it a stir once in a while.

We add to ours all year and as it thaws in the spring and the pile sinks, we add more soil and the process starts again.

The Terrace Bay Council has agreed to apply to the Ministry of the Environment for a grant to buy 100 *City Gardener Composters* from the *We Recycle Corporation* if enough interest is shown.

Composting is a real and positive action individuals can do to make a difference.

cut us off and then we have no water again," says Long.

"I'm not saying this would happen, but I want to make sure it's covered. If there's an

easement, that means nobody can cut (the water line) off."

If arrangements can be made to provide the building with water, the BDC hopes to purchase the building to provide

office space for a number of projects, says Long.

"We're hoping to provide office space for ourselves and Community Futures, as well as space for Canada Employment," she says.

"And also, we want to provide temporary office space—and by that I mean once a week for government bodies like Fednor and the Ministry of Northern Development and Mines."

Having government groups open up offices in town would make it easier for the BDC to obtain funding for different business projects, says Long.

"Right now it's tough for me to get money from these levels of government," she says. "But if they have somebody set up here to monitor these businesses, it's would be easier for me to get money from them."

Plans also call for two retail and one more office spaces, as well as a combination confer-
