

Reluctant tenants are holding up the opening of the Pays Plat Business Centre, which was originally scheduled for early this spring.

"We're having trouble finding tenants to rent the spaces," says reserve spokesperson John Bouchard.

"It was supposed to open this spring, but we have no tenants to go in there right now."

The centre, which boasts 6,000 square feet of commercial space, is eventually intended to house a restaurant, a 24hour gas station/convenience store, a laundromat, a craft store, and an arcade.


