"The average residential assessment in Terrace Bay is about \$11,000," says Fulton. "And a mill is what's applied to each \$1,000 of that."

Municipal expenditures include a projected \$37,480 increase in the cost of running the Terrace Bay Police Services. That increase is due

mostly to the cost of creating and running of the Police Services Board.

The budget also calls for a cut of \$26,419 in the total expenses of the Reeve and Council.

Last year, the total budget for Reeve and Council, including salaries, travel and accommodation expenses, was \$102,939.

By cutting back on things such as the amount of travel
