Lack of funds holding up the new Schreiber Medical /Dental centre

Overall cuts in ministry funding is basically what's holding up Schreiber's new medical/dental centre, says a Ministry of Northern Devel-Mines and opment spokesperson.

"The real crunch here is the availability of capital funding," says Katie Heikkenen. "We're short of funds this year like never before."

Heikkenen says that Schreiber's application has been sent back to the township to have a few matters clarified. Once that's done, the application moves to the next stage.

"And that stage is looking at the funding viability of the proposal—what they are looking at for the total cost of the building, does the ministry have funding for the project this year or next year, that kind of thing," says Heikkenen.

"After that would be the actual working drawing and tendering, and finally, minister approval."

determining

whether or not a community is eligible for funding, she says a number of factors are

taken into consideration. "First of all, does the area have a full complement of health professionals," she says. "The Ministry of Health has guidelines, that there be one physician for every 900-1,200 people.

examine "Then we whether or not the area has trouble in attracting or retaining medical professionals —often communities seem to change doctors about once a


Other factors, such as the condition of the existing medical facilities and whether or not a new facility would help the community attract health care professionals, are also considered says Heikkenen.

"In many northern Ontario communities there are what we call 'turn-key' facilities," she says.

"That means that when a new doctor comes, they don't have to start building bricks or mortar. They can go right


Support for Wardrope Park


