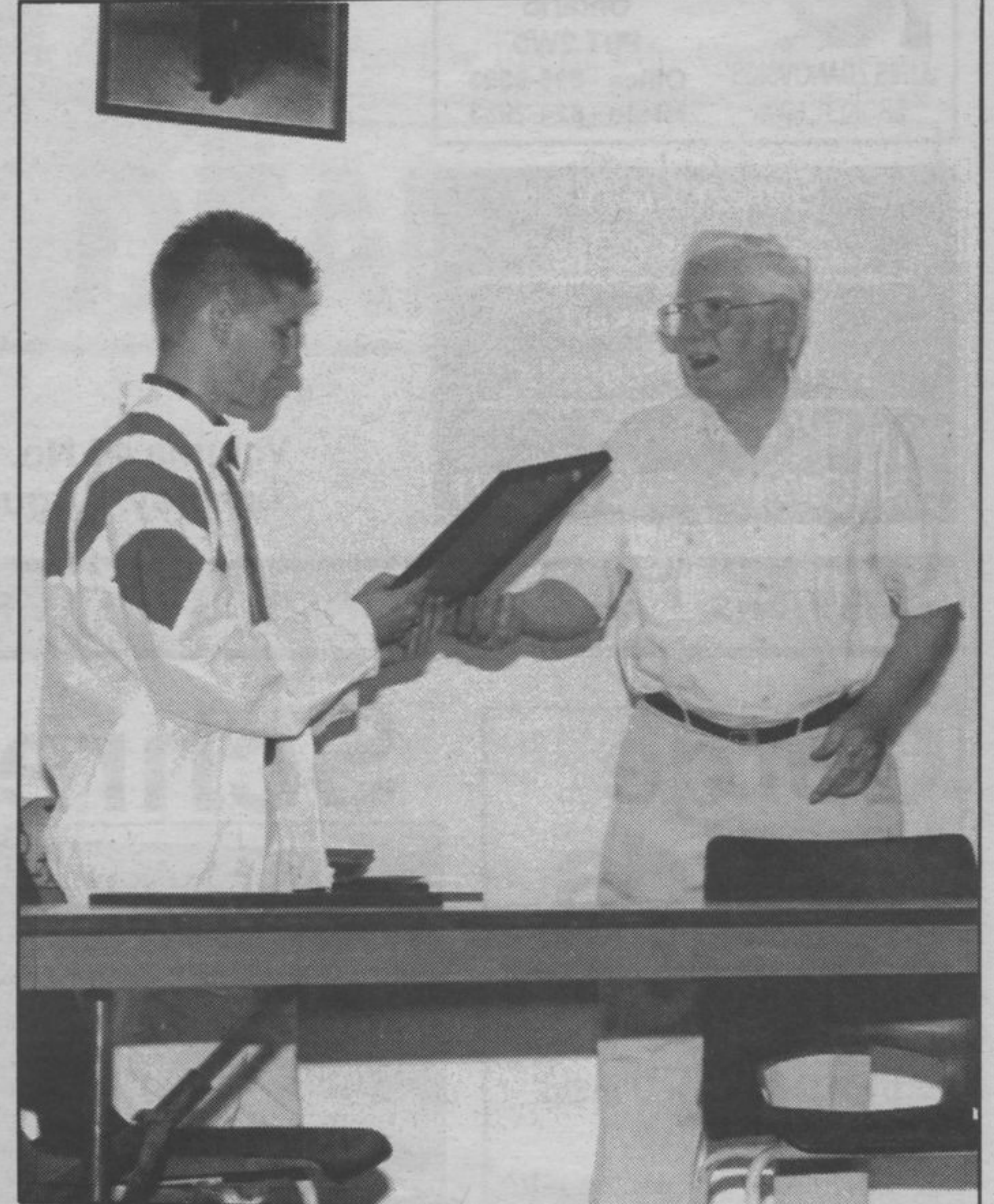


Welcoming home a hometown Olympian

But he eventually realized that his goal was to make it to Barcelona, and that he had achieved that goal.

"But I really didn't know what to expect when I came home," he said. "The support I've received in Schreiber has really picked me up again."

Filane said he hopes to do

more training in Schreiber, and only travel to Toronto to "fine tune" his training before major competitions.

His next title defence is in December, so for now, he has time for a little break.

"I'll also be setting up my own sportswear company," he said. "I want to concentrate on

that for the next couple of months."

But whatever happens in the future, Filane said he'll always remember the support he's received from Schreiber.

"Wherever I go, my heart will be with Schreiber," he said. "And wherever this life takes me, Schreiber will always be my home."

"It's a design problem."
"I feel that the people who designed it should have let us know if the boards were going to twist," said Reeve Jim Ziegler. "That's what we hired

them for."
Township Engineer Ray Mikkonen said that if stringers had been placed under the sloped areas, the twisting of the boards would have been less severe. Stringers are cen-

tre support beams that would have run down the middle of the deck, stabilizing the top boards.

The cost of putting stringers in is estimated at \$5,076.

If the letter to Moore /George doesn't have the desired effect, Coun. King said he thinks the Township should sue.

"I say we sue and go for court costs as well," he said.

"And if we win, it doesn't cost us anything. And if we lose, at least we tried."
