brand new."

Approximately 80 per cent of the cost of the work has been raised, and Elkin says work should be completed by the end of August.

"Without the work and support of the parishioners, this church simply would not

exist," says Elkin.

The church itself is unique on the North Shore because it's been around for so long, he says.

"It's kind of a novel situation in that this is a 100-year-old church," says Elkin. "To have a church celebrate its centennial is rare."

False stereotypes of Russians as cold, militaristic people had been demolished, replaced with authentic memories of soft-spoken Russians wearing genuinely warm smiles. Russians who might have had preconceived ideas of North Americans as cold, heartless capitalists left with memories of "ordinary folks" making life on a Great Lake very much like their Baikal.

The Russians are in an uphill battle, defining a new economic and political system somewhere between capitalism and state socialism, while at the same time doing all they can to protect what they call their "diamond," Lake Baikal. The North Americans will continue their efforts to clean up Lake Superior. Both sides will now be doing their work with a firm new foundation—international friendship. Friendships like that are precious diamonds.
