Cullmar awarded tender

Cullmar Construction of Terrace Bay has been awarded the job of building an observation deck next to the Tourist Information Centre in Terrace Bay.

At a special meeting of Council Aug. 18, Cullmar's tender of \$6,252 was accepted subject to approval of Township Engineer Ray Mikkonen.

Cullmar outbid 638058 Ontario Inc., also of Terrace Bay, who submitted a bid of \$6,640.

The work is being done

through a grant from the Ministry of Northern Development and Mines, who will pay for 75 per cent of the total cost. The Municipality will pick up the rest.

The work is expected to be completed by the end of September.

"We'll be doing some other work up there in terms of land-

scaping and sinage as part of the same grant," says Terrace Bay Clerk-Treasurer Dave Fulton.

Fulton also says that a sinage program, funded in part through a PRIDE grant from the Ministry of Municipal Affairs, is also in the works.

"We've got the gorge sign to work on, and, depending on whether or not we can get approval from the Ministry of Transportation (MTO), they'll be some new signs put up when you come into town."

New directional signs for Simcoe Plaza and the Aguasabon Beach are also

planned, says Fulton.

"We're hoping to have the signs made starting this fall, but they may not be up until next year," he says.

Bélair in Congo

Réginald Bélair, MP for Cochrane-Superior and Liberal Forestry Critic, has been selected to monitor elections in the Congo.

Despite various difficulties and delays, the Congo held June and July parliamentary elections. The first round of voting was on Aug. 2, and the last one on Aug. 19.

As an observer, Bélair has

participated in the international observation exercise of voting day in the country, as well as the announcement of the results of the votes.

Upon his return from the Congo, he will brief the Department of External Affairs on the last days of the campaign.
