Back to school time give all school-age children a lesson on PLAY TAKE A MOMENT FOR SAFETY BASICS

1. Make sure your child knows how to ride from someone he or she trusts.
2. Show your child how to call for summon help.
3. Teach your child to know their street address and telephone number. For schoolers, fastening their seat belt is a good idea.
4. Tell your child when to call for help of emergency.
5. Remind your child to look both ways before crossing the street.
6. Instruct your child to never go somewhere after school without a parent.
7. Review your child's knowledge of choosing the populated areas, avoiding heavily wooded areas, and staying away from
