inventory attractions and opportunities for development along the route.

They will be looking for scenic and historic attractions for operators of large boats on Long Lake. They will also see what the Kenogami and

Aguasabon Rivers have to offer canoeists and operators of small boats.

"This study will determine if these waters could lead to new tourism opportunities for the area," says Gilles Pouliot, Lake Nipigon MPP and Minister of Transportation responsible for Francophone Affairs. "If development is feasible, a waterway could help visitor stays in the region and provide a substantial boost to the area's

economy."

The consultants, EDA Collaborative of Toronto, will work with a steering committee of community people. Their report will be released next spring. Study costs will also be supported by the Town of Longlac and the Schreiber-Terrace Bay Community Futures organization, who will be kicking in about \$5,000 each for the study.

"The steering committee will supervise and direct the

consultants," says Community Future's Leslie Dickson. In addition to Dickson, Mike Moore and Jim Forbes of the Terrace Bay Tourism Committee and John Wilcox of Community Futures make up the local representation on the project's steering committee.

Dickson says that groups who will be affected by whatever development takes place on the rivers will also be invited to join the committee.

"The steering committee will be the group that decides what needs to be addressed and how, and makes sure the consultants keep to the plan and to the schedule," she says.

Although committee members have ideas about what kind of development should take place on the rivers, Dickson says the committee needs public input.

"We'll be holding public meetings to get an idea of what the public thinks will and won't work, and what they think are the opportunities and constraints of possible tourism developments," she says.

"The steering committee will be the main group that the consultants will report to, but it won't just be our ideas going into the study."
