Criminal court

On Wednesday, Aug. 26, 1992, Judge Walneck presided over criminal court.

Chris Labbe was found guilty of a Schreiber OPP charge of taking a vehicle without the owner's consent. He was given 12 months probation, 60 hours community service work, and must pay restitution of \$12,952.

Gregory Rule was found guilty of a Terrace Bay Police Services charge of consuming liquor in a place other than a residence, licensed place or private place. He was fined \$103.75.

Gaetan St. Martin was found guilty of a Schreiber OPP charge of driving with more than 80 mgs of alcohol in the bloodstream. He was fined \$600 and given one year driving prohibition.

Jody Waldenberger was found guilty of a Terrace Bay Police Services charge of driving with more than 80 mgs of alcohol in the bloodstream. Waldenberger was given 14 days in jail and received a two year driving prohibition.

Morris Zaporzan was found guilty of a Schreiber OPP

charge of causing a disturbance. He received a conditional discharge and was given six months probation.

The next Criminal Court date is set for Sept. 23, 1992.

Carbon Monoxide killed couple

A husband and wife found dead in their trailer at the Rossport Campgrounds were asphixiated by carbon monoxide, police say.

"It appears as though one of their appliances were faulty," says Schreiber OPP Sgt. Andy Templar.

Dead are Walter Raymond, 76, and his wife Marjorie Raymond, 68. The couple was from South Dakota, and were found Sunday, Aug. 30, by the park warden. They arrived at the park Saturday evening.

"When the propane is burning, and it's not properly ventilated, it produces carbon monoxide, and it builds up until it puts you out," says Templar.

Hydro opens Hayes Lake Dam

Ontario Hydro opened Hayes Lake Control Dam at noon Sept. 3 in order to control the lake's water level.

"We've had quite a blast of rain over the past little while, and that particular watershed is particularly flashy," says Mike Boutlier, Hydro's Regional Operating Supervisor.

Boutlier says that if the dam isn't opened, the water level would exceed the flood allowance and cause shore

Solly winner of Campbell Trophy

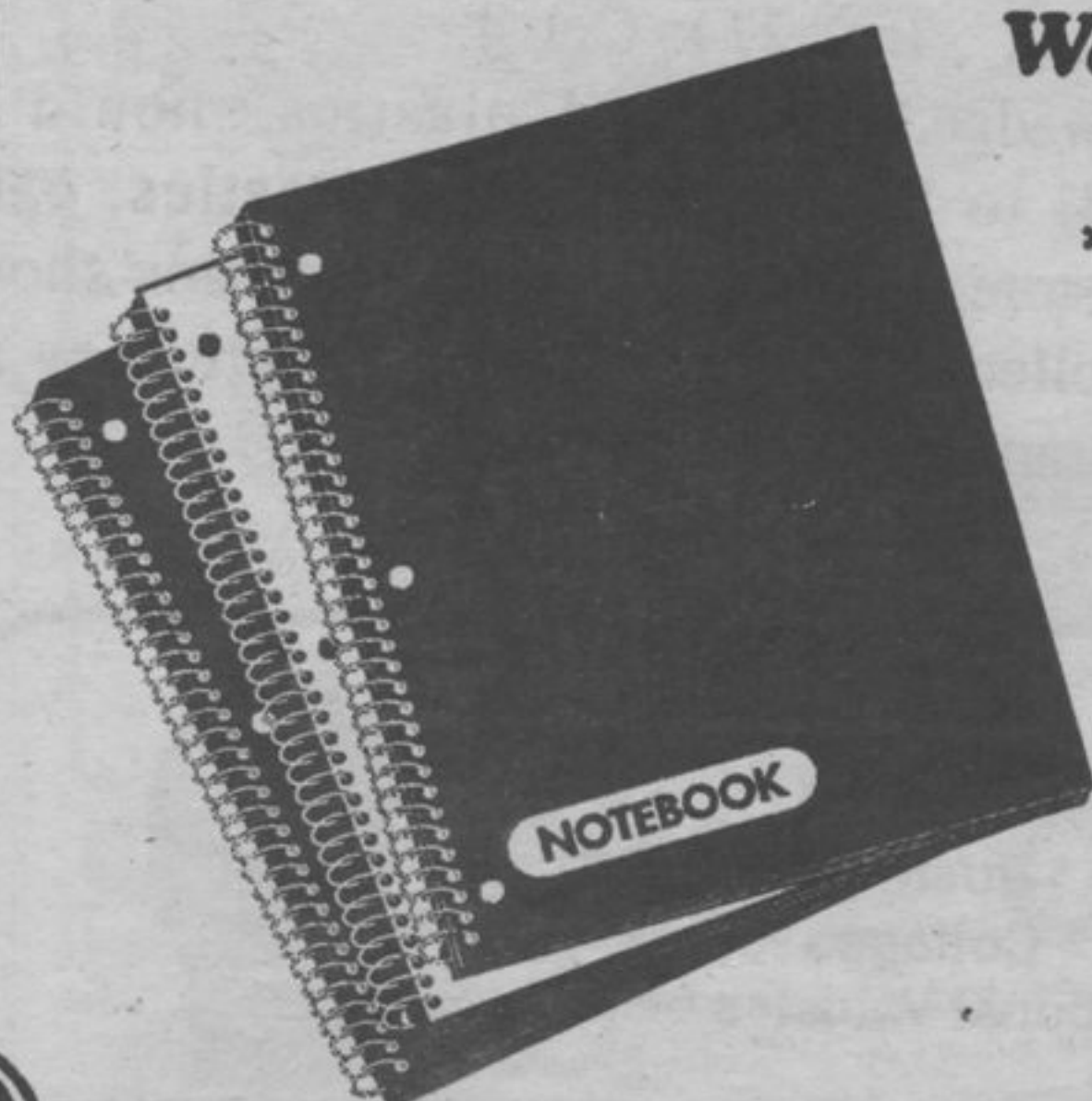
