kit. A battery powered radio and a flashlight together with extra batteries are essential. The power is bound to be out and your radio may be your only link to vital information.

- Choose your shelter—a basement, or even a spot under the stairs or a heavy desk or counter on the ground floor in the centre of the building away from outside walls and windows are good places to weather storms.

- If you are caught outside, take shelter immediately. As a last resort, lie flat in a ditch, excavation or culvert.

- Reduce the hazards—Trim dead trees and branches from around your home to reduce the danger of them blocking an exit or causing damage or injury. Check the drainage around your home to reduce the effect of prolonged, torrential rains from flooding the basement.

- Prepare your vehicle—always have a fairly full tank of gasoline in your car. Gas stations may not be able to operate for several days during or after a severe storm. You may have to evacuate on short notice.

*When a severe storm threatens:*

- Listen to a local radio or tv station for warnings or advice. Make sure your battery-powered radio is nearby, as there may be a prolonged power outage.

- Bring in or tie down garbage cans, garden tools, planters and patio furniture. Flying objects can damage property and cause injury.

- Avoid travelling unless told to evacuate. If ordered or advised to evacuate, take identification for the family, cash and credit cards.
