

The Recommended Changes To The Trees Act

The Ministry of Natural Resources (MNR) has been asked to amend the current Trees Act to give all municipalities the opportunity to pass local bylaws to protect trees.

The Tree Bylaws Advisory Committee, with members from the Association of Municipalities of Ontario and the province, has recommended changes to the Trees Act.

The ministry will welcome public comments on the recommendations until September 30, 1992.

The Recommendations Propose To:

- allow municipalities to pass bylaws that meet local needs for regulating the removal of trees on private lands
- provide local citizens with the opportunity for input into how the cutting of entire woodlots, important stands of trees, or heritage trees, might affect the community
- · give landowners an opportunity for input into the development of local bylaws
- prevent misuse of wooded land by allowing local councils, in certain circumstances, to issue stop-work orders or require that permits be obtained before cutting trees

The Recommendations Do Not Intend To:

- prevent anyone from cutting trees on their own property for their own use, or the properly planned harvesting of trees, in accordance with good forestry practice
- regulate farm crops such as Christmas tree crops, orchard stock and trees for landscaping

The publication Before You Cut That Tree has more information on the recommended changes to the Trees Act. It is available at local MNR offices.
