## Take it Personally

AIDS. You can get it personally—from just one sexual encounter. But even though you may not have it, AIDS can affect you personally. Since 1981, over 2600 of your neighbours in Ontario have been diagnosed with AIDS. Well over half of them have died.

It is estimated that up to 100 people in Northwestern Ontario know that they are HIV positive. AIDS is now right at home here.

We should be concerned. There is a risk of spreading the disease. But there is the greater risk of spreading misinformation about AIDS, and heaping prejudice on those living with it. AIDS may be fatal. But it is not spread through everyday contact—like shaking hands.
