Reporting to the Supervisor of Direct Services within the framework of Prevention and Family Support Services, you will be responsible for the delivery of a wide range of programs that are community-based, family focused and culturally relevant.

You will be responsible to provide support and supervision to community-based Family Support Workers and to become personally and professionally familiar with assigned communities - Lake Helen, Pays Plat and Rocky Bay First Nations.

To qualify, preferably candidates will have a BSW and/or Social Services Diploma with a minimum of two years direct service experience with Native children, families and groups, along with a minimum of one year supervisory experience. You should have good communication, organization and interpersonal skills and the ability to work effectively under pressure. You should possess a sound knowledge of human behavior theories for use in assessment and planned interventions. Experience in case management, an asset.

You should have the ability to work flexible hours and to travel extensively.

SALARY: Commensurate with experience and qualifications.

A knowledge and understanding of the Anishnabe people - our culture, our values, and our traditions is important for this position. The ability to speak Ojibway is considered an asset, but not essential. You should have a commitment to supporting and helping Native families and communities to be strong and self-determined.

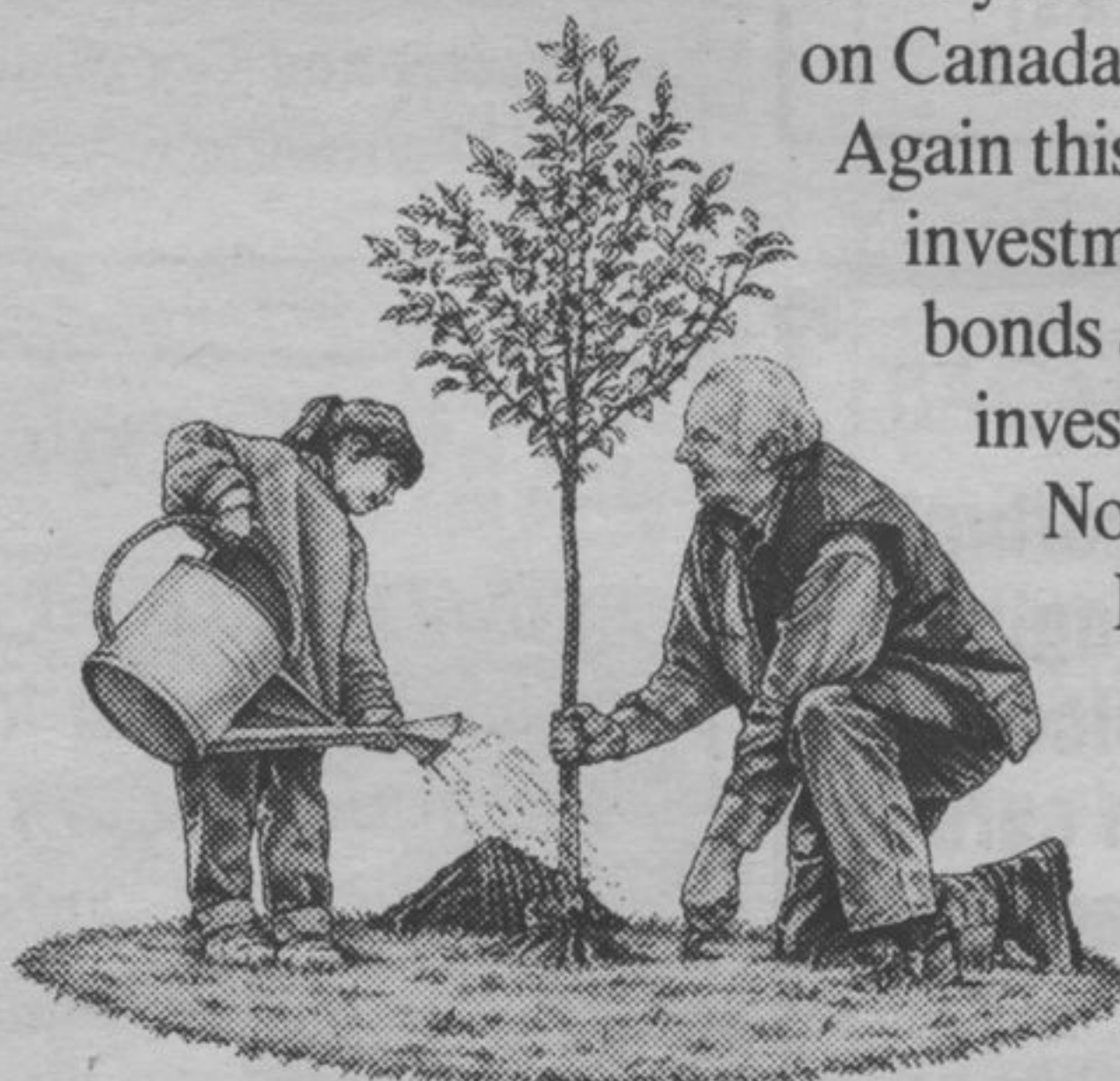
