Referendum '92: no local events planned for this area so far

There's not much happening locally for the upcoming Oct. 26 referendum on the Charlottetown Accord.

Neither Terrace Bay or Schreiber Townships have plans to take part in any official way. In separate interviews, Terrace Bay Clerk-Treasurer Dave Fulton and Schreiber Reeve Bob Krause said that the towns won't be taking part.

"I think it's up to the government to sell it," said Krause.

Lake Superior High School teacher Roy Handy says he considered trying to organize a public debate at LSHS, but was unsure who he could get to debate the issues.

"One of the problems was that, offhand, I'm unaware of anyone in the towns who could be set up in a debate on the accord who the general public would consider qualified to speak," says Handy.

He says that even if he could get a prominent politician such as Rég Bélair to come and debate the 'Yes' side of the equation, finding a comparable speaker for the 'No' side would be difficult.

Unfortunately, Handy says he has no Canadian History classes are scheduled until next semester.

"If I had my classes this semester, we probably would be concentrating (on the referendum) almost exclusively for the next month," he says. "But I have ancient history this month, and it's kind of hard to work in the Charlottetown Accord into ancient Egypt."

One class the accord has come up in this semester is economics, says Handy.

"There's lots of economic arguments going back and forth in the campaign," he says. "So we've been discussing the economic principles upon which those claims are based."

process," he says. "All hospitals should be, but some don't bother to get (accredited.)"


But Fewer says that not only is there a certain amount of prestige involved in getting a three-year accreditation, there's a practical side to it as well.

"It lets people know that their hospital is as good as any hospital in Canada," he says. "And if there is litigation for malpractice, if we meet the CCHF standards, the litigation is normally not as severe as it would be if we weren't accredited."

Fewer says that another advantage is that it gives them an idea of what they're doing well.
