continued from page 1 office, and the investigation heated up.

With assistance and direction from local coroner Dr. Keith Wilkes, a post mortem examination of the wolf was done. It showed that the wolf had sustained severe injuries to its rear end at two points—both of which corresponded to the bumper and headlights on the snowmobile.

"We had an expert witness, Dr. George Kolenofsky, who is a Provincial Predator Research Scientist with the MNR," says Dennis. "He was able to identify 50 (wolf) hairs in the snow-mobile that were left as a result

of the collision."

The cowl, windshield and front bumper of the snowmo-bile were damaged as a result of the collision, he says.

"The wolf was chased across a frozen lake, and was struck from behind, mortally wounding it,' says Dennis.

"Evidence at the trial suggested that the wolf was finally finished off with a blow to the head with an axe."

The bruising on the animal's head was consistent with the shape of an axe found on the snowmobile, he says.
