

Advise players about equipment

Do you help your players with the selection and maintenance of their equipment?

Protective equipment is an essential part of hockey safety. You must ensure that players' equipment fits properly, provides quality protection and is well maintained.

Proper fitting skates are crucial to skating development. Advise players selecting skates to wear the same socks they wear when skating, and to ensure there is one finger space between the boot and heel when toes are touching the front. Lace up both skates tight and walk around before deciding.

When selecting a stick, young players should pick youth sizes with narrower shafts and shorter blades. A stick is proper length if it barely reaches the chin of a player in street shoes. Remember to consider lie and flexibility.

Equipment like protective cups shin, shoulder and elbow pads, pants, helmets and gloves, should absorb the shock of impact and distribute force over a wide

area. A piece of equipment should completely cover the area it's supposed to and not be too tight or too loose.

Be alert for cracks or breaks in equipment like helmets, and tears or loose padding in other pieces. Make parents aware of improperly fitting and damaged equipment, and emphasize the risk of players participating with inadequate protection.

After games and practices, players should hang up equipment to dry, and wipe skate blades, leaving them unlaced with tongues pulled down. Frequently check blades for straightness, missing rivets and remove nicks with an edge shaving stone.

A coach should make frequent inspections of players' equipment to ensure safety and quality!

The card will simplify the current licensing system, will enhance enforcement, and will significantly reduce paperwork.

Issuing the card to Ontario's hunters and anglers is only the first phase of the Ministry's plan to implement a fully automated licensing system by 1994-95.

Provincial Parks EA Launched

Public consultation for the development of the Class Environmental Assessment for Provincial Park Management was officially launched in August, 1992.

The kickoff coincided with the release of the booklet Environmental Class Assessment for Provincial Park Management - Special

Report Number One: An Invitation to Participate.

a\Anyone interested in the Parks Class EA can pick up a copy of the booklet from the district or area offices.

This booklet is the first of a series. A second booklet will consolidate and summarize the comments received based on input from the first booklet. Public consultation early in the project is a key factor in the development of the class environmental assessment.
