"There is no integrity within the consultative process as applied by the soliciter general and the Ontario Chiefs cannot suppress their concerns and the concerns of their officers for the safety and security of all persons and property in this province."

Barber goes on to say that the association wrote Premier Bob Rae, appealing to him to meet with them to discuss possible solutions to the impasse over the proposed regulations.

"We have made it very clear

to the premier that we do not condone the refusal of some members of our forces to carry out lawful orders," said Barber. "However, we cannot ignore the fact that the manner in which this regulation was finally developed has triggered unprecedented frustration in police officers and police administrations throughout the province."

Officers across the province would be affected by the new regulations, since it is provincial legislation.
